 - 2. Trouble Inflicted by Others - Sometimes someone else caused it.
 - 3. Trouble Inflicted by Life - Sometimes life simply happens.

Where is God when I am in trouble?

- 1. GOD SEES
I am not invisible.
- 2. GOD HEARS
My cries are not ignored.
- 3. GOD KNOWS
My pain is not misunderstood.
- 4. GOD CAME DOWN

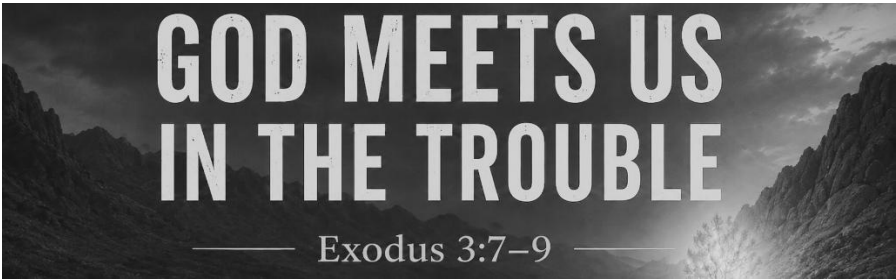
